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1 CHMN. KATZ: Ms. Grabel, are you waiting for
2 anybody else from your clientele or your firm to join us?

3 MS. GRABEL: Good morning, Mr. Chairman. I'm
4 taking a look at the Zoom apps, and it looks like we're
5 all here.

6 CHMN. KATZ: Okay. And since we do have a new
7 court reporter working with us, I would just ask you, if
8 I haven't already introduced you, I know that Ms. Grabel
9 will be answering most of the questions. If you need to
10 turn it over to anyone else to answer a question, please
11 make sure that they identify themselves for the benefit
12 of our reporter. And when we start our hearing next
13 week, I'm going to instruct our Committee Members to make
14 sure that they're either asking for my permission so that
15 I can introduce them before they ask a question or
16 basically to have them identify themselves if they are
17 asking a question until Ms. Taylor becomes familiar with
18 the handful of us.

19 Anyhow, to get things started, I do understand
20 that we have lodging arrangements made at the
21 Hampton Inn & Suites. And that is in Tucson right on the
22 Marana border, I believe. Or it may actually be --

23 MS. GRABEL: Yes.

24 CHMN. KATZ: -- or it may actually be in Marana,
25 where I have the address. And we are going to be

1 starting at 1:00 o'clock, correct, next Monday?

2 MS. GRABEL: That's correct. Yes, Chairman.

3 CHMN. KATZ: And I'm not sure. I'll probably
4 leave early enough so I can check in the hotel rather
5 than hauling my baggage to a late -- to a late check-in,
6 but I'm not going to come in until Monday. I'll probably
7 leave the Phoenix area at about 10:00 a.m. and get there
8 by noon or earlier.

9 And I also did notice, Ms. Grabel, that you have
10 filed a Request to Intervene on behalf of Tucson Electric
11 Power, who will be hooking up with the facilities in
12 question. And I'm assuming there's no conflicts between
13 AEPCO and Tucson Electric Power and that they and you are
14 comfortable in representing both?

15 MS. GRABEL: Yes, Chairman. It's -- actually,
16 I'm fortunate enough to represent both good utilities.
17 And the project, they are project partners, well-aligned,
18 and so this is cost effective for them to be jointly
19 represented.

20 CHMN. KATZ: And that's fine. Since you're
21 participating anyhow -- and you may call -- I just got a
22 Notice of Witnesses. You may call an additional witness
23 from TEP; correct?

24 MS. GRABEL: Yes. Mr. Chris Lindsey. He's
25 actually on the call today.

1 CHMN. KATZ: Okay. And you have the one
2 witness, is it Mr. Barnes, from -- on behalf of the
3 applicant, correct, is your only witness?

4 MS. GRABEL: Actually, no. We have two -- three
5 witnesses.

6 CHMN. KATZ: Okay.

7 MS. GRABEL: Kevin Barnes, from Arizona Electric
8 Power Cooperative. Also Randall Simpson testifying as to
9 the environmental issues. He's from Burns & Mac. And I
10 believe we have a third witness.

11 Randy, you might want to help me out. He's
12 going to talk about public outreach. I think
13 that's correct.

14 MR. SIMPSON: Yeah. Travis Levitt will be our
15 public involvement expert.

16 CHMN. KATZ: And not that it's super critical,
17 but I do have the testimony summary of Kevin Barnes, but
18 I don't have the witness summaries of the other two. So
19 if you could have someone email that either to Tod or to
20 me in the next day or so, I'd appreciate it.

21 And outside of that, I did receive the Notice of
22 Public Hearing document that you sent over -- or that I
23 received today. It just gives the time and place of the
24 hearing on a map. I'll treat that as a Prehearing
25 Exhibit 1. Prehearing Exhibit 2 will be the site -- it's

1 the map of the site, or of the route, with the sign
2 locations. And I also have a -- an Exhibit Prehearing 3
3 that is the route tour itinerary. And we'll just need to
4 make sure the court reporter gets copies of those
5 exhibits. I also have a draft copy of the CEC, but we
6 don't need to go through that today.

7 And you've been with us in prior hearings,
8 Member -- Ms. Grabel, and know how we usually go ahead
9 and review and edit the CEC before Tod finalizes it and
10 sends it to me for signature.

11 And how many days do you think this is going to
12 take, and do you think -- we'll -- we'll get to the
13 hearing -- to the tour issue later, but do you think that
14 it will be helpful in this case to have a tour?

15 I mean, it's ultimately up to the Committee to
16 decide. Some of the Line Siting hearings we haven't been
17 doing it. There was one not too long ago on the west
18 side of Phoenix where it was very important to take the
19 tour because the power -- it was a lengthy transmission
20 line that went adjacent to or even very -- in close
21 proximity to various subdivisions.

22 So where are we at in terms of likely time frame
23 and whether or not you think we should take a tour?

24 MS. GRABEL: So the time frame of the hearing --
25 we -- we don't anticipate any opposition right now. We

1 have just a couple of witnesses. So I believe we can be
2 done certainly by Wednesday.

3 The tour, if we have the tour beyond the virtual
4 tour, probably will take up about half the day. So it
5 may be that we bleed into Thursday. I find it unlikely,
6 but that's possible.

7 I think the tour, it's really up to the
8 Committee's discretion. As I said, because there's not
9 any opposition, I don't necessarily think it's going to
10 be important for that reason. It's a reasonably short
11 line relative to others that the Committee has reviewed.
12 It does run near one homeowners association -- one
13 subdivision. I don't -- again, we don't anticipate any
14 opposition from those homeowners. If the Committee wants
15 to see the proximity to that area, it might be something
16 that they'd be interested in doing.

17 CHMN. KATZ: I'll leave it to them. And if I
18 have a lapse in memory, before we get started, let me --
19 remind me to make sure that I ask the Committee. I
20 usually do that as a matter of course. And some of these
21 don't -- it doesn't make sense to take a tour. But if we
22 were going to do it, when would we likely do that?
23 Tuesday morning, or what were your thoughts?

24 MS. GRABEL: We talked about Tuesday morning.
25 We hope that we could probably get at least one of the

1 panels finished, if not two panels Monday afternoon prior
2 to public comment, we'd take the tour, and then the next
3 morning probably resume the hearing after the lunch hour
4 and then wrap up with the CEC either that afternoon or
5 Wednesday morning.

6 CHMN. KATZ: Okay. And I will just ask a
7 leading question, but I'm assuming the applicant, with
8 your assistance, has complied with ARS
9 Section 40-360-04(A), that notice has been given to the
10 affected jurisdictions as required by the Procedural
11 Order. And if so, who are those jurisdictions?

12 MS. GRABEL: Yes, Chairman. Thank you. We did
13 provide Notice to the Affected Jurisdictions on May 9th,
14 as statutorily required, and the affected jurisdictions
15 are the Town of Marana, Pima County, the Arizona State
16 Land Department.

17 CHMN. KATZ: Okay. Now, I'm -- I just want to
18 make sure that you've complied with all the posting and
19 publishing requirements of 40-360.04(A).

20 MS. GRABEL: Yeah, we've published the Notice of
21 Hearing in the Arizona Daily Star, which is a newspaper
22 of general -- general circulation in the Tucson and
23 Marana area. That was published to May 6th and May 7th.
24 And we also posted signs. And you'll see the exhibit.
25 You will have to help me with the hearing exhibit number,

1 but we do include a map of the sign locations that we
2 agreed to in the pre-filing conference, and those were
3 published as well.

4 CHMN. KATZ: I do have that map, and we'll treat
5 it as Prehearing Exhibit Number 2.

6 MS. GRABEL: Thank you.

7 CHMN. KATZ: And I don't know if there's any
8 need for us to discuss the agenda. It's pretty routine.
9 And we're starting the hearing at 1:00 o'clock on Monday
10 the 6th, and from that point on we'll be starting at
11 likely 9:00 a.m. We'll have a public comment session, if
12 anybody appears at all, at about 5:30 on the first day of
13 the hearing. And if a tour is going to be taken, we'll
14 do that on Tuesday morning for about a half a day. We'll
15 have to see what the Committee feels is appropriate.

16 I'm assuming, unlike another matter, that we
17 might not have a public -- a large number of public
18 members present, that there is no need for a -- for
19 security?

20 MS. GRABEL: No, Chairman.

21 CHMN. KATZ: Okay.

22 MS. GRABEL: We don't believe we will have much
23 public comment, if any.

24 CHMN. KATZ: Right. And if you want any daily
25 transcripts, you'll need to make a request. But whether

1 or not that request is made, we're going to take a break
2 during our hearing about every 90 minutes plus or minus a
3 few depending on how things are going.

4 And I'm assuming that you'll be using one of the
5 companies that we've regularly used, so we'll have a
6 good, robust Wi-Fi, as well as the ability for Committee
7 Members and the public to observe and/or participate
8 virtually?

9 MS. GRABEL: We will have robust Wi-Fi. We're
10 actually providing the A Team. Prior to your time,
11 Chairman, those I -- AV Team was considered the best of
12 the best in terms of line siting. And they virtually
13 reacquired the ability to do these virtually. So we're
14 going to have the A Team again, and you'll be --

15 CHMN. KATZ: That's fine.

16 MS. GRABEL: -- glad to hear.

17 CHMN. KATZ: One of the notes in my standard
18 form is preparation of the spreadsheet to include each
19 segment. I don't think we need to have a spreadsheet,
20 unless you've already prepared one. I already know the
21 tour logistics, if we take it. And you'll be doing a
22 virtual fly-over if we don't take an in-person tour;
23 correct?

24 MS. GRABEL: We'll probably do a virtual
25 fly-over and the in-person tour --

1 CHMN. KATZ: Fine.

2 MS. GRABEL: -- unless the Committee decides
3 they don't want the in-person tour.

4 CHMN. KATZ: Right. And, again, if you think
5 it's going to be very important for us to do it, we'll do
6 it. All right. Or at least we'll suggest we'll do it.
7 I can't think and speak for nine other members of this
8 Committee.

9 And one of the things I have done is, Zach
10 Branum from the Corporation Commission won't be present,
11 but I have asked him to have someone present and have
12 spoken with Steve Emedi, counsel. He's going to be
13 observing virtually because at the last hearing we had an
14 issue coming up regarding confidentiality of certain
15 records that we needed input from the Commission, and we
16 had zero people there. So I -- if Zach is not going to
17 be able to participate in our hearing, I'm asking that
18 the Corporation Commission have another observer
19 available in case any of us or the Committee Members have
20 any questions.

21 MS. GRABEL: I do notice that Mr. Carpinelli
22 from the Arizona Corporation Commission is here with us
23 today.

24 CHMN. KATZ: Well, I wasn't paying much
25 attention, but I do see him. And welcome.

1 MR. CARPINELLI: Good morning.

2 CHMN. KATZ: And, again, we don't need someone
3 from the Commission there and present. If Zach Branum
4 isn't present, we'd like to have either you or Steve
5 Emedi or somebody available in the remote. Of course the
6 one time we didn't have it was the only time we needed a
7 question to be answered by the Commission.

8 And what we'll do -- I don't know if we want to
9 have a -- like Exhibits AEPCO 1, 2, 3, 4, et cetera, and
10 then TEP Exhibit 1 or 2 or whether we want to just
11 consecutively number the exhibits. I don't know what
12 your thoughts are, Ms. Grabel.

13 MS. GRABEL: We filed the exhibits, Chairman, on
14 Friday, and we did separately identify them. So we have
15 AEPCO's Exhibits 1 through 13, or whatever it was, and
16 then TEP's Exhibits 1 and 2.

17 CHMN. KATZ: That's fine. And what will also
18 happen is when we actually try to settle the terms and
19 conditions of the Certificate of Environmental
20 Compliance, also known as the CEC, there will be -- are
21 we doing one CEC; correct?

22 MS. GRABEL: Yes, we have one applicant.

23 CHMN. KATZ: Right.

24 MS. GRABEL: That's the way --

25 CHMN. KATZ: The last one I had one applicant,

1 but we had two different locations and they filed two
2 separate CECs, but that's because, I think, SRP or APS
3 was going to eventually take over one of those two lines.
4 But, anyway, there'll probably be a Chairman 1 exhibit
5 and a Chairman 2 exhibit, which will be one in the PDF
6 version of the Certificate of Environmental Compliance,
7 just so the Commissioners and we know where we started,
8 and then there'll be a Word version that we will edit
9 by -- with input from the applicant and Committee Members
10 and myself. And that -- once that's finalized, that will
11 be a -- a Chair Exhibit Number 2, and a copy of that will
12 end up being sent to Tod Brewer, our paralegal, who will
13 then make sure it is grammatically correct and will send
14 it to me for signature. I'll review it and sign it if it
15 passes, and I'm relatively certain it will.

16 I'm just reviewing my checklist here. Are there
17 any other legal issues that we need to discuss?

18 MS. GRABEL: No legal issues, Chairman, no. I
19 do have one logistical request --

20 CHMN. KATZ: Sure.

21 MS. GRABEL: -- at this time.

22 CHMN. KATZ: Go ahead.

23 MS. GRABEL: And that is our AV Team needs the
24 email addresses of those Committee Members who will be
25 participating remotely. So if we could have those sent

1 to us so I could pass them along to James, our AV guy.

2 CHMN. KATZ: That's fine.

3 And have we received, Tod, any notice as to -- I
4 know that Zach Branum will be out of country, and I know
5 that Leonard Drago will be on vacation, but I'm expecting
6 everybody else to be present either virtually or in
7 person.

8 Tod, do we know who is going to be in person and
9 who's going to be virtual, or hasn't that been
10 communicated as of yet?

11 MR. BREWER: I have not received that
12 information yet, Mr. Chairman, but I will certainly send
13 a request out and update Ms. Grabel as I receive those
14 notices.

15 CHMN. KATZ: I don't have a problem if you were
16 to send her all of the Committee Members email addresses,
17 but if you want to wait and see and send her just those
18 appearing virtually, that'll be great. But I want to
19 make sure that they have access to the Zoom link. There
20 was a little problem in our last hearing where it wasn't
21 readily available to the Committee Members or the public,
22 I'm not sure which was which, but there were obviously
23 two separate links. And there was some members of the
24 public actually just -- it was just two members of La Paz
25 County that were in support of the project. But, anyway,

1 enough of that said.

2 I don't think we need to go through the CEC at
3 this time. We don't have multiple parties in the
4 litigation, at least any party that's opposed. So I
5 don't -- I won't go through the CEC. We'll save that
6 until after the evidence is presented, unless there's any
7 issue you wanted to point out to me in advance that's of
8 concern.

9 MS. GRABEL: There is not, Chairman.

10 CHMN. KATZ: And I'm assuming that the applicant
11 has applied for and/or received any permits that might be
12 required for the project from the federal, state, county,
13 or city government. So I'm assuming that those permits
14 have all been applied for, if not received?

15 MS. GRABEL: I don't know the answer to that.

16 I don't know, Mr. Barnes, if you want to chime
17 in here.

18 I know that the applicant will apply for any
19 permits that are required.

20 CHMN. KATZ: And I understand he'll have to -- I
21 understand they'll have to handle those, but I don't know
22 if Mr. Barnes wants to comment. If he does, he should
23 feel free to do so.

24 KEVIN BARNES: Chairman Katz, this is Kevin
25 Barnes. I'm the environmental permitting and land

1 services manager for Arizona Electric Power. We're a
2 federal borrower, so we'll have to go through the needs
3 process, and we'll do the permitting once we get our
4 route approved.

5 CHMN. KATZ: Okay. Has your application already
6 been filed?

7 KEVIN BARNES: It has not.

8 CHMN. KATZ: Okay. But that's something,
9 obviously, you'll need to get done. And -- and that's
10 because you're receiving monies from the federal
11 government, not because we're traversing federal lands;
12 correct?

13 MR. BARNES: That's correct.

14 CHMN. KATZ: And I always like to get one hard
15 copy of the exhibits. Most of the Committee Members will
16 follow along, as will I, electronically, but I like to
17 keep a copy of exhibits for our permanent records down
18 the road. So I don't think every Member needs a
19 notebook, but you may want to have a few of those
20 available.

21 Are there any other issues that we need to
22 discuss or should be concerned with, or are we basically
23 ready to go?

24 MS. GRABEL: Chairman, I think we're ready to
25 go.

1 CHMN. KATZ: And, Tod, is there anything that
2 this senile old man forgot to review with the parties
3 this morning?

4 MR. BREWER: Not that I'm aware of,
5 Mr. Chairman.

6 I did misspoke -- misspeak earlier, Ms. Grabel.
7 I do have the list of the Members who will be attending
8 virtually, and I'm sending that to you now.

9 CHMN. KATZ: Okay. I thank everybody. I
10 look -- some of you I know very well and others I haven't
11 met before, but I look forward to working with all of
12 you. I look forward to not driving our new court
13 reporter too crazy.

14 And you don't need be bashful either during the
15 hearing, Cathy. If we start talking over each other or
16 our talking too quietly or there's equipment problems,
17 don't hesitate to interrupt us to make sure we end up
18 with a good record.

19 MR. ANCHARSKI: Chairman?

20 CHMN. KATZ: Yes.

21 MR. ANCHARSKI: Sorry. This is Elias Ancharski.
22 I believe my mic was not working earlier.

23 CHMN. KATZ: Okay.

24 MR. ANCHARSKI: I wanted to chime in.

25 You had asked about the testimony summaries of

1 the additional witnesses for AEPCO. Those are labeled
2 AEPCO 12 and AEPCO 14. So those were included in
3 those -- those -- the initial exhibit filings, just
4 later, just -- just kind of in the -- in the sequence of
5 order that we kind of intended to present them. So they
6 are a little bit later in that filing. So if you still
7 need those, happy to re-send those, but you should have
8 received those through our filings electronically and --
9 and in the paper format.

10 CHMN. KATZ: Right. And what I haven't done is
11 I haven't received the paper yet, but it's early in the
12 week. But I know that there were like 400 pages of
13 exhibits and -- or something like that, and I don't have
14 time, obviously, to print all of those.

15 MR. ANCHARSKI: We -- we did drop a -- a
16 specific copy off at your offices for you on Friday --

17 CHMN. KATZ: Okay.

18 MR. ANCHARSKI: -- so -- so hopefully that --
19 that should be floating around somewhere.

20 CHMN. KATZ: It probably -- it probably will be.
21 And will you be participating as well in the hearing with
22 Ms. Grabel?

23 MR. ANCHARSKI: Yes. Yes, I intend to.

24 CHMN. KATZ: Okay. Well, look forward to seeing
25 all of you. Have a good week. And rest up over the

1 weekend so we're ready to go. And I don't think you'll
2 beat the record of our last hearing. That was about a
3 total of two quarter-mile lines in the middle of La Paz
4 County, all on La Paz County property, and we finished, I
5 think, at 10:30 or 11:00 in the morning, which was
6 unheard of. So if we get this done in a day and a half
7 or two days, we'll be fine.

8 Thank you all.

9 MS. GRABEL: If you don't take a tour,
10 Mr. Chairman, we'll try to beat that record.

11 CHMN. KATZ: Oh, that's going to be almost
12 impossible.

13 Anyway, you guys all take -- ladies and
14 gentlemen, take care. And try to work hard this week so
15 you can relax and psych up for Monday's hearing. We'll
16 see you all there. Take care.

17 MS. GRABEL: Thank you.

18 CHMN. KATZ: Bye-bye.

19 MR. ANCHARSKI: Thank you.

20 MS. GRABEL: Bye.

- The attached Figure 1 – Proposed Route map illustrates the location of the route traveling from the Planned Adonis Substation (east of Interstate 10) along Owl Head Ranch Road towards the west to the existing Marana Substation (west of Interstate 10) adjacent to North Trico Road.

Route Stop Location #1

- The tour will start at the Planned Adonis Substation, located at the intersection of Owl Head Ranch Road and the 115/138 kV transmission line corridor. The transmission line corridor is approximately 1 mile northeast of the CAP Canal.
- From this point, the tour will continue southwest along Owl Head Ranch Road.

Route Stop Location #2

- The second stop will be along Owl Head Ranch Road approximately ¼ mile southwest of the Planned Adonis Substation.
- From this point, the tour will continue southwest along Owl Head Ranch Road.

Route Stop Location #3

- The third stop will be at the CAP Trail, which crosses over Owl Head Ranch Road approximately ¼ mile east of the CAP Canal.
- From this point, the tour will continue southwest along Owl Head Ranch Road.

Route Stop Location #4

- The fourth stop will be at the CAP Canal, which crosses under a bridge along West Cochise Canyon Trail.
- From this point, the tour will continue southwest along West Cochise Canyon Trail.



Route Stop Location #5

- The fifth stop will be along the northern property boundary of the San Lucas Community. Approximately 300 feet west of the intersection of West Cochise Canyon Trail with the CAP Canal.
- From this point, the tour will continue west along West Cochise Canyon Trail crossing underneath Interstate 10. The tour will then turn north along the frontage road towards the intersection of West Sagebrush Road.

Route Stop Location #6

- The sixth stop will be at the crossing of Interstate 10 and the UPRR tracks. The location is along the west side of Interstate 10 frontage road where it intersects with West Sagebrush Road.
- From this point, the tour will continue west along West Sagebrush Road approximately ½ mile, then turn south along North Sanders Road for ½ mile to the intersection of West Marana Road.

Route Stop Location #7

- The seventh stop will be at the North Sanders Road and West Marana Road.
- From this point, the tour will continue west along West Marana Road approximately ½ mile.

Route Stop Location #8

- The eighth stop will be near the TEP Substation Siting Area located approximately at the ½ section line (midpoint) between North Sanders Road and North Wentz Road.
- From this point, the tour will continue west along West Marana Road approximately 1 mile.

Route Stop Location #9

- The ninth stop will be near along West Marana Road approximately at the ½ section line (midpoint) between North Wentz Road and North Lockett Road.
- From this point, the tour will continue west along West Marana Road approximately 1 mile to the bridge that crossing over top of the Santa Cruz River.

Route Stop Location #10

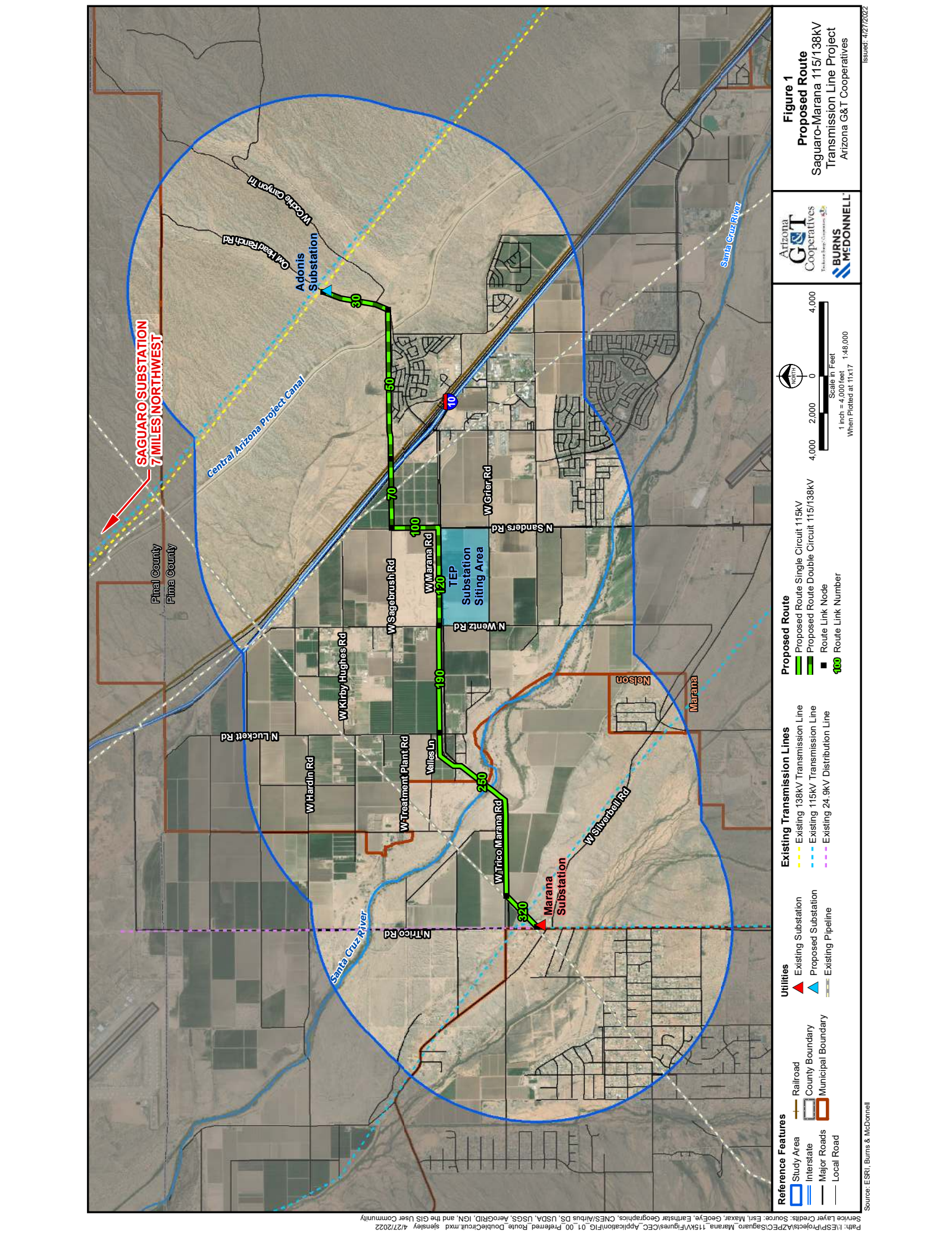
- The tenth stop will be bridge crossing over top of the Santa Cruz Rive along West Marana Road.
- From this point, the tour will continue west along West Marana Road approximately 1 mile.

Route Stop Location #11

- The eleventh stop will be along West Trico Marana Road approximately ½ mile east of North Trico Road.
- From this point, the tour will continue west along West Trico Marana Road approximately ½ mile. The tour will then turn south along North Trico Marana Road terminating at the Marana Substation.

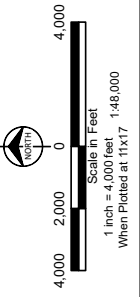
Route Stop Location #12
